

To make this craft all you will need is construction paper, a glue stick and a pair of scissors.

cut two egg shapes out of white construction paper. Each egg was a little less than a quarter of the size of a piece of paper.

Use a glue stick to glue the pieces to the egg shapes. For a more mosaic look, leave a little space in between each small piece. Do not worry if the pieces hang over the edge of the egg, you can trim the excess off later

Use a half of a sheet of light blue construction paper for our backdrop and cut a sheet of green paper into a strip of grass and glued it to the bottom.

Once the backdrop was ready, we glued our eggs into place







## B for bunny

What You Do:

- 1. Place the piece of light pink paper vertically and draw a capital letter B.
- 2. Cut two bunny ear shapes out of the white piece of paper.
- 3. Then cut two slightly smaller bunny ear shapes out of the hot pink piece of paper.
- 4. Glue the pink ears on top of your white ears and let dry.
- 5. Trace the letter B with glue.
- 6. Begin placing cotton balls along the glue until the B is covered.
- 7. Glue the eyes inside the top loop of the B.
- 8. Draw a nose, mouth, and whiskers with the pink and black markers to finish the bunny

### sticky eggs and material

- contact paper
- construction paper
- pom poms
- tissue paper
- scrap paper
- scissors
- pipe cleaner pieces
- sequins
- thin buttons
- painters tape

There are so many different materials you can use for this craft so use your imagination!

### Here's how you set up an Easter egg sticky wall:

Start by cutting out a large oval from a large piece of construction paper.



Next stick a piece of clear contact paper over one side of the construction paper. This will make it so that one side of your oval is sticky and one side is smooth.


Stick the construction paper onto a flat surface (we like to use a window) using painter's tape. Make sure that you put the paper on the window sticky side out!

When you are ready to stick things on the sticky wall just set them up next the the sticky wall area and let your child explore the fun materials and stick them onto the wall to create a decorated egg.

# Softest No-Cook PlayDough Recipe

- · 2 cups flour
- 2 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup salt
- 2 tbsp cream of tartar
- 1 to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)
- food colouring
- few drops glycerine (optional makes it silky)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Combine the dry ingredients and the oil in a large heat-proof bowl or pot.
- 2. Add food colouring to the water and then add the coloured water to the bowl/pot.
- 3. Stir until combined (will be sticky).
- 4. Knead in the glycerine. Continue to knead until ingredients are well blended (2-3 minutes).
- 5. Store in air tight container.

What You'll need: painted footprints, strips of green for carrot top, and tape

How we made it:
Paint footprint.
Cut footprint out.
Cut strips of green paper or a paint swatch.
Tape green strips on back (top) of "carrot."
